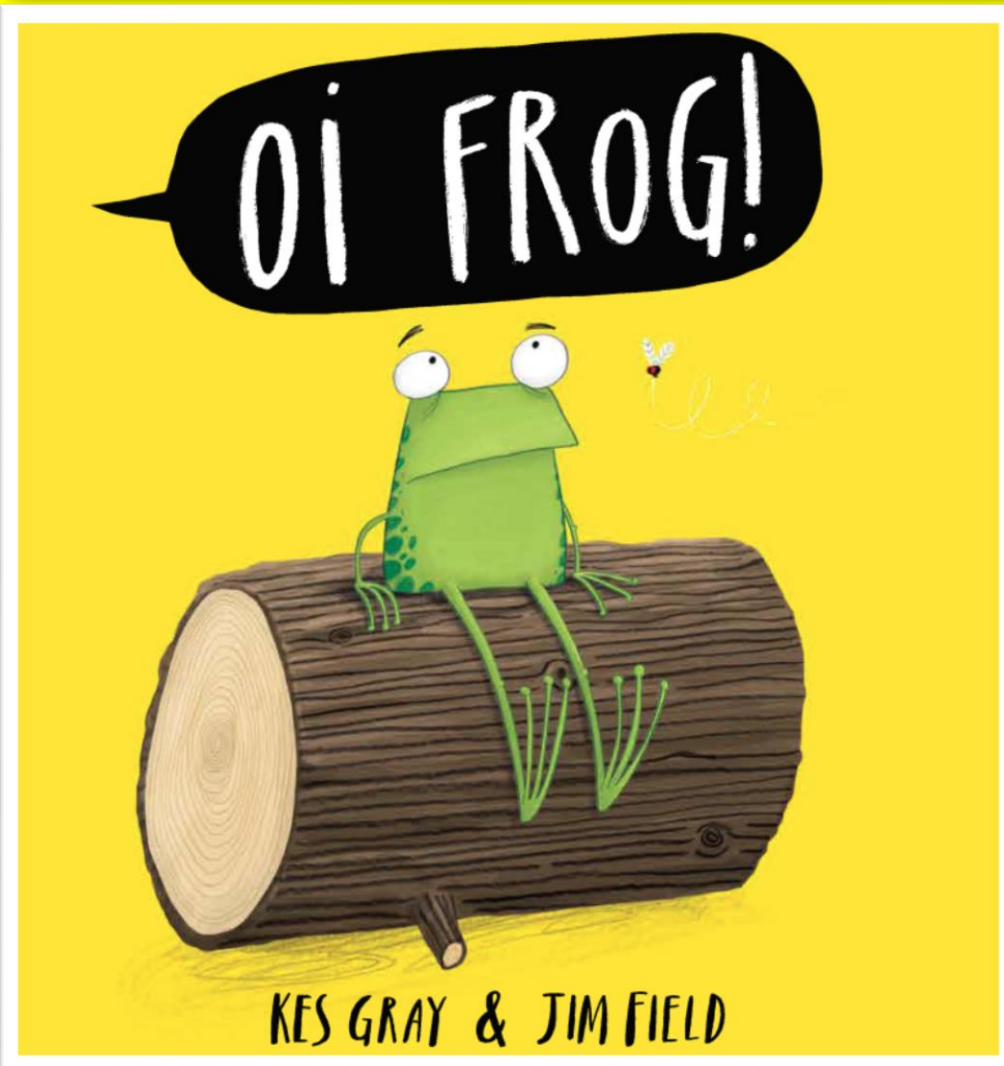

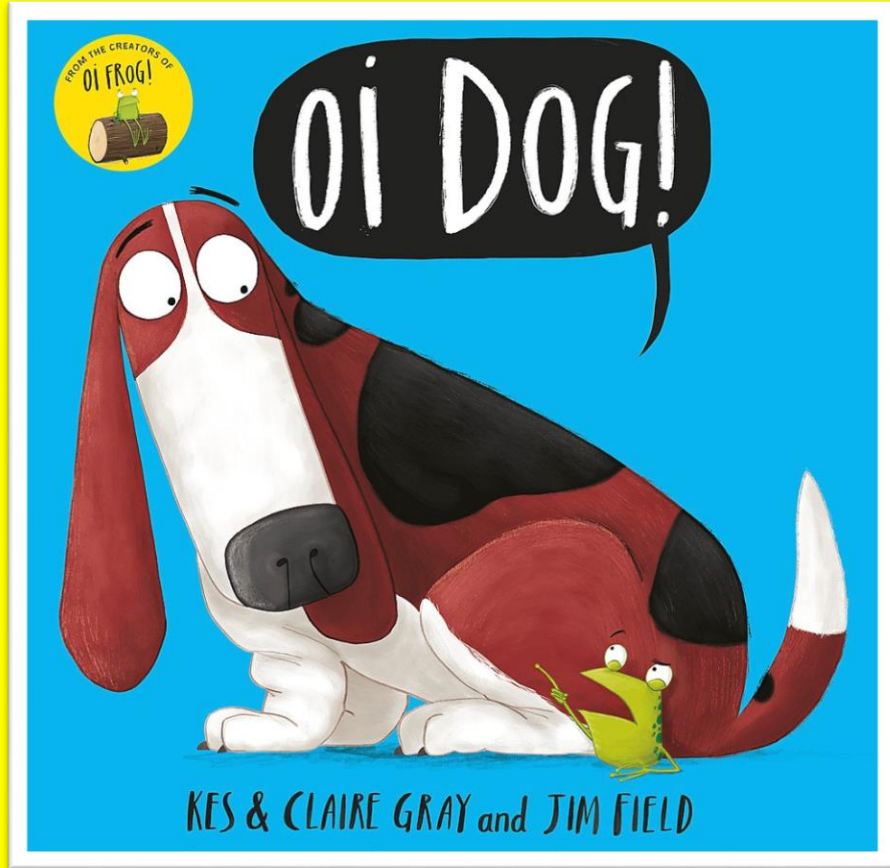

said the frog.

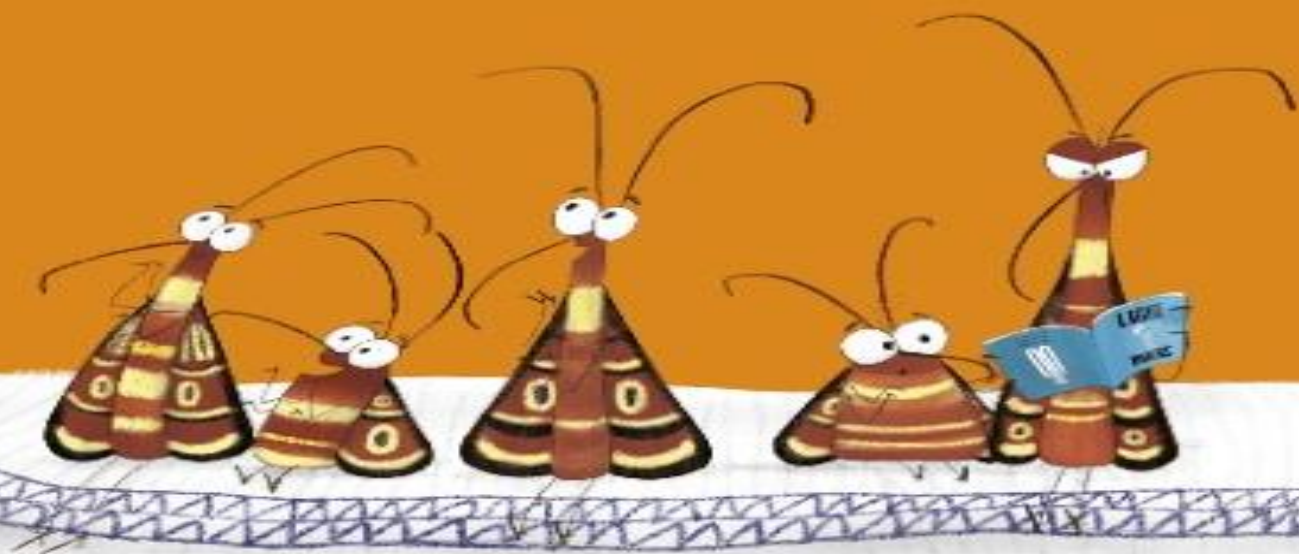

**flies** will sit on **pies**,





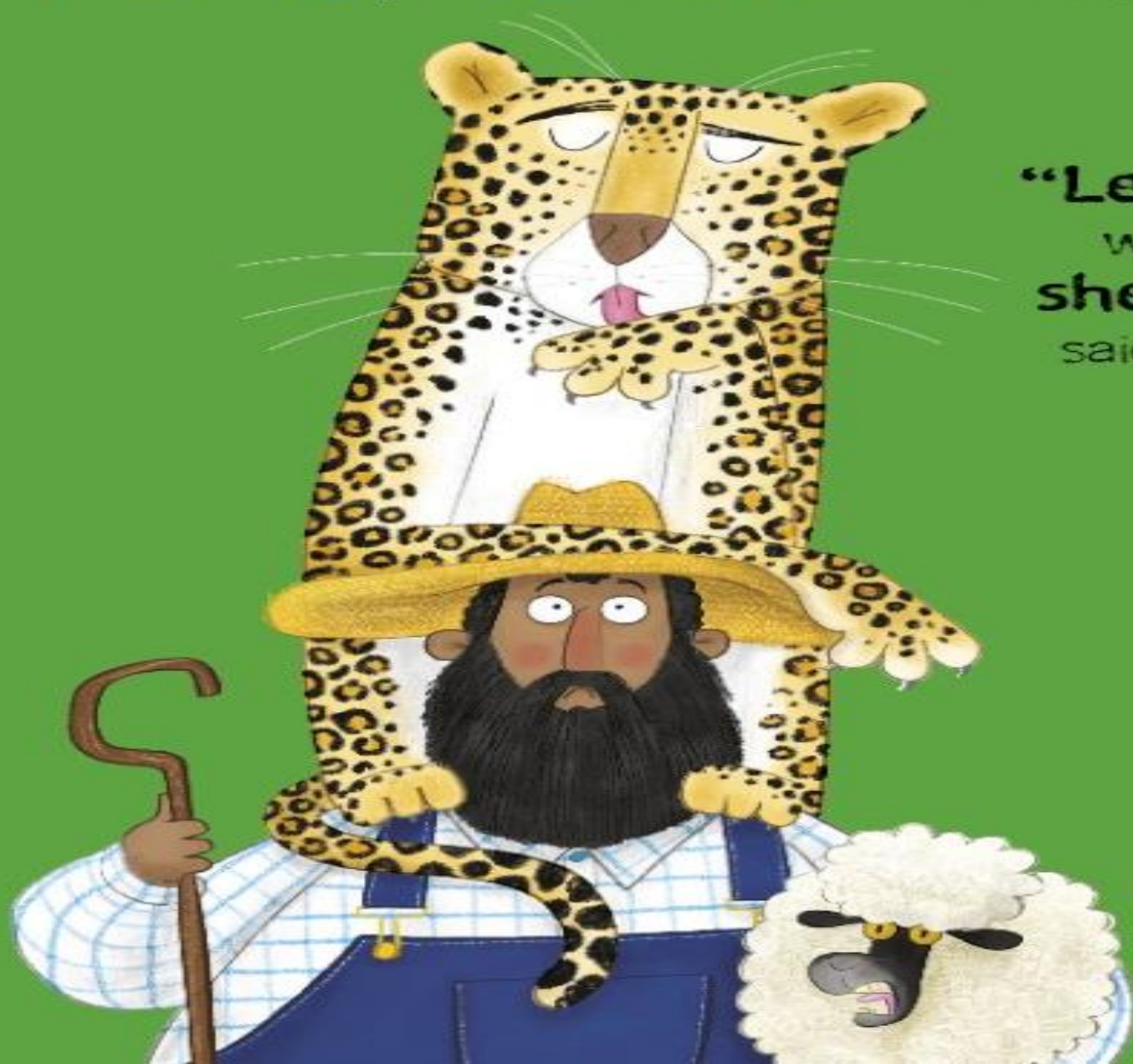
**crickets** will sit on **tickets**,

and **moths** will sit on **cloths.**"





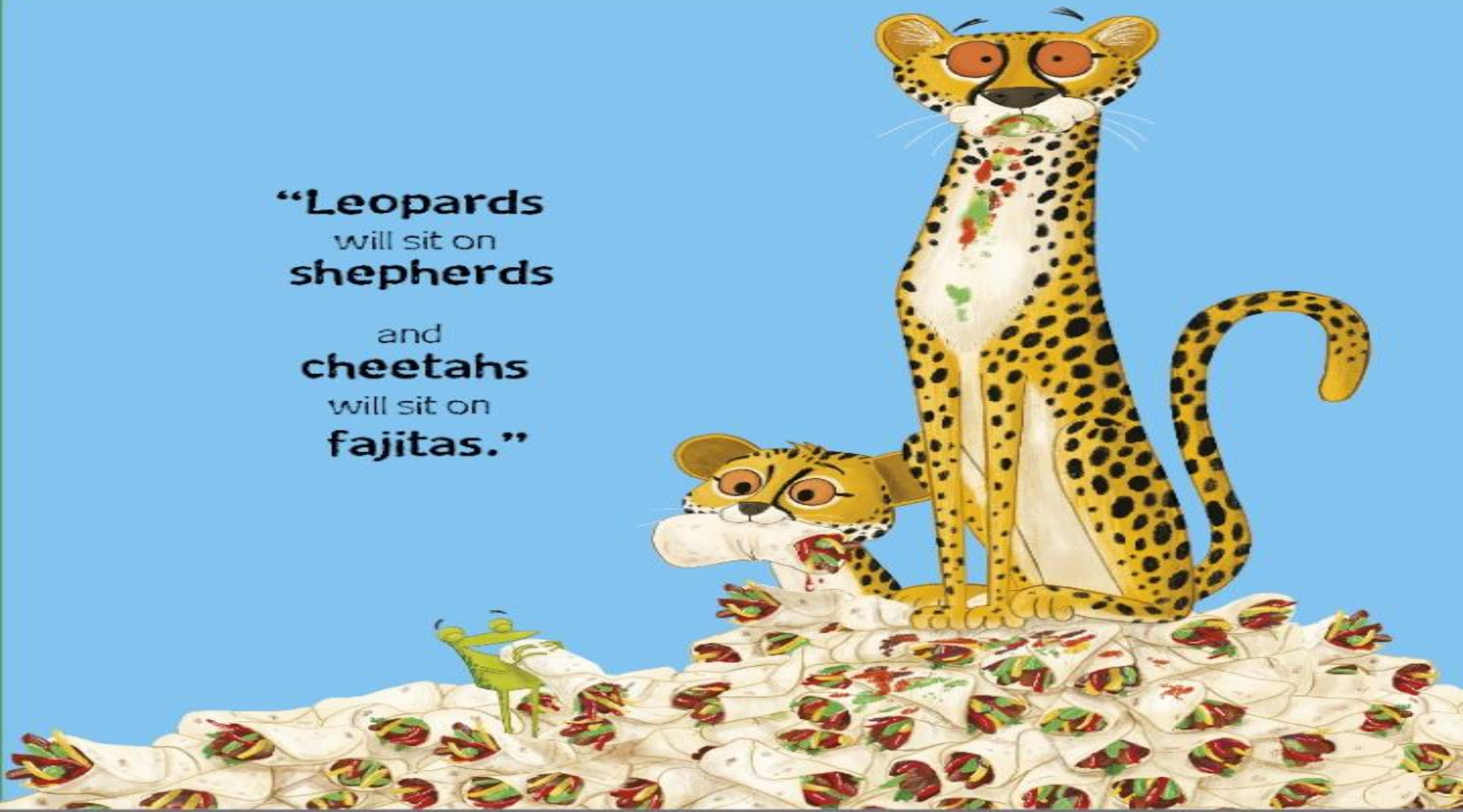
“What will **leopards** sit on?” asked the dog.

will sit on oars."

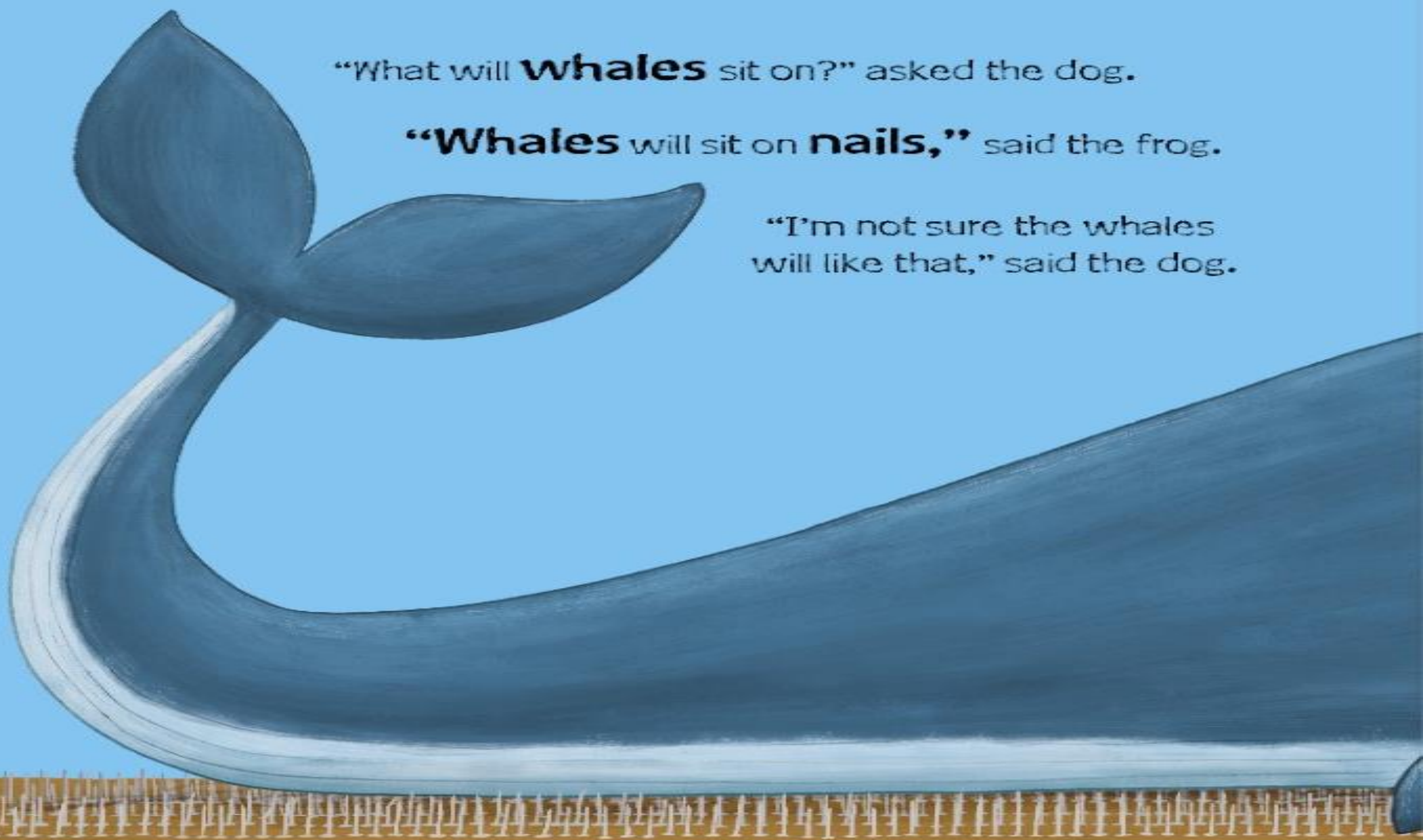




“What will **whales** sit on?” asked the dog.

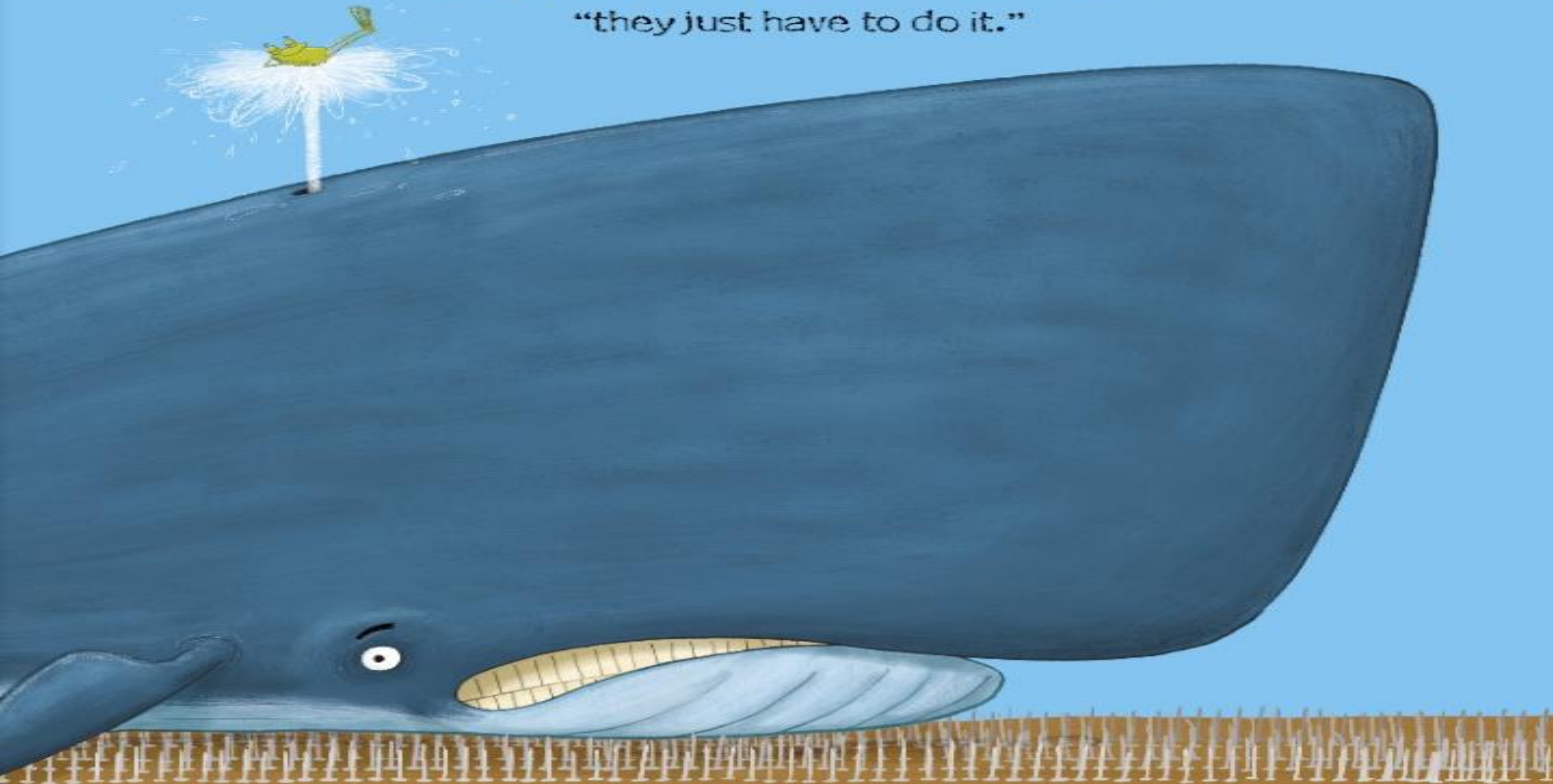
“**Whales** will sit on **nails,**” said the frog.

will like that,” said the dog.

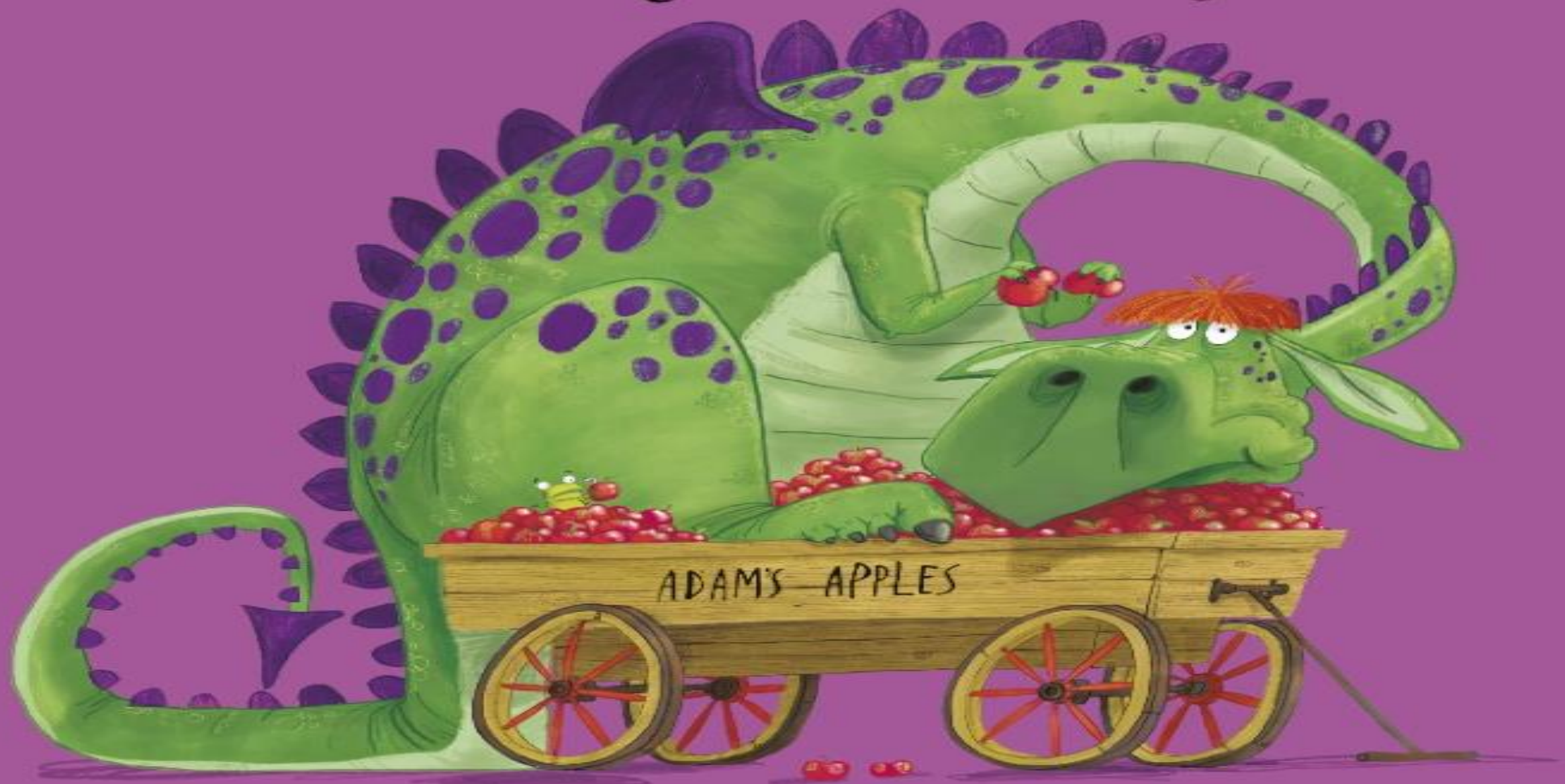




"They don't have to like it," said the frog.

**cornets**,

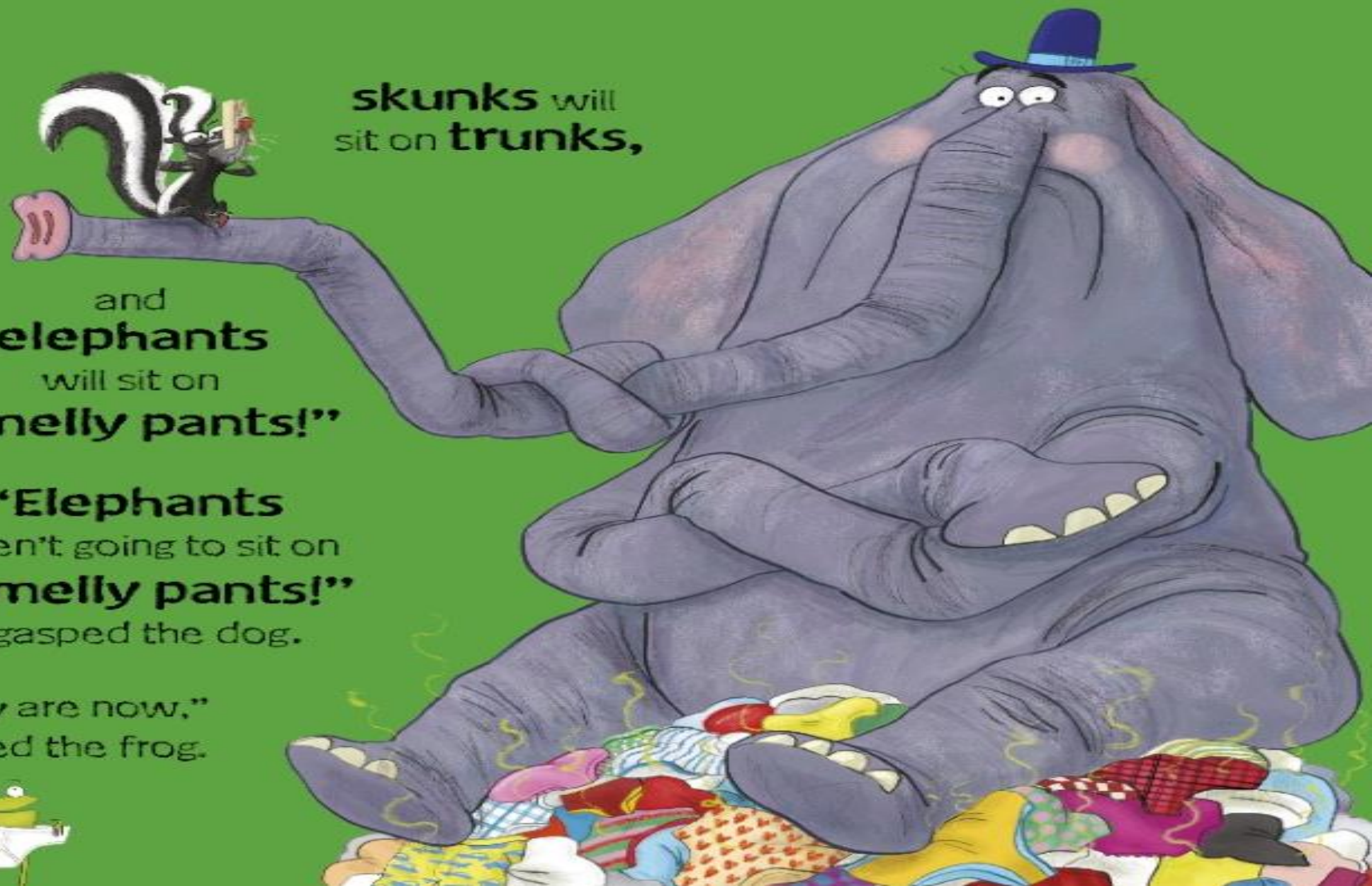


skunks will

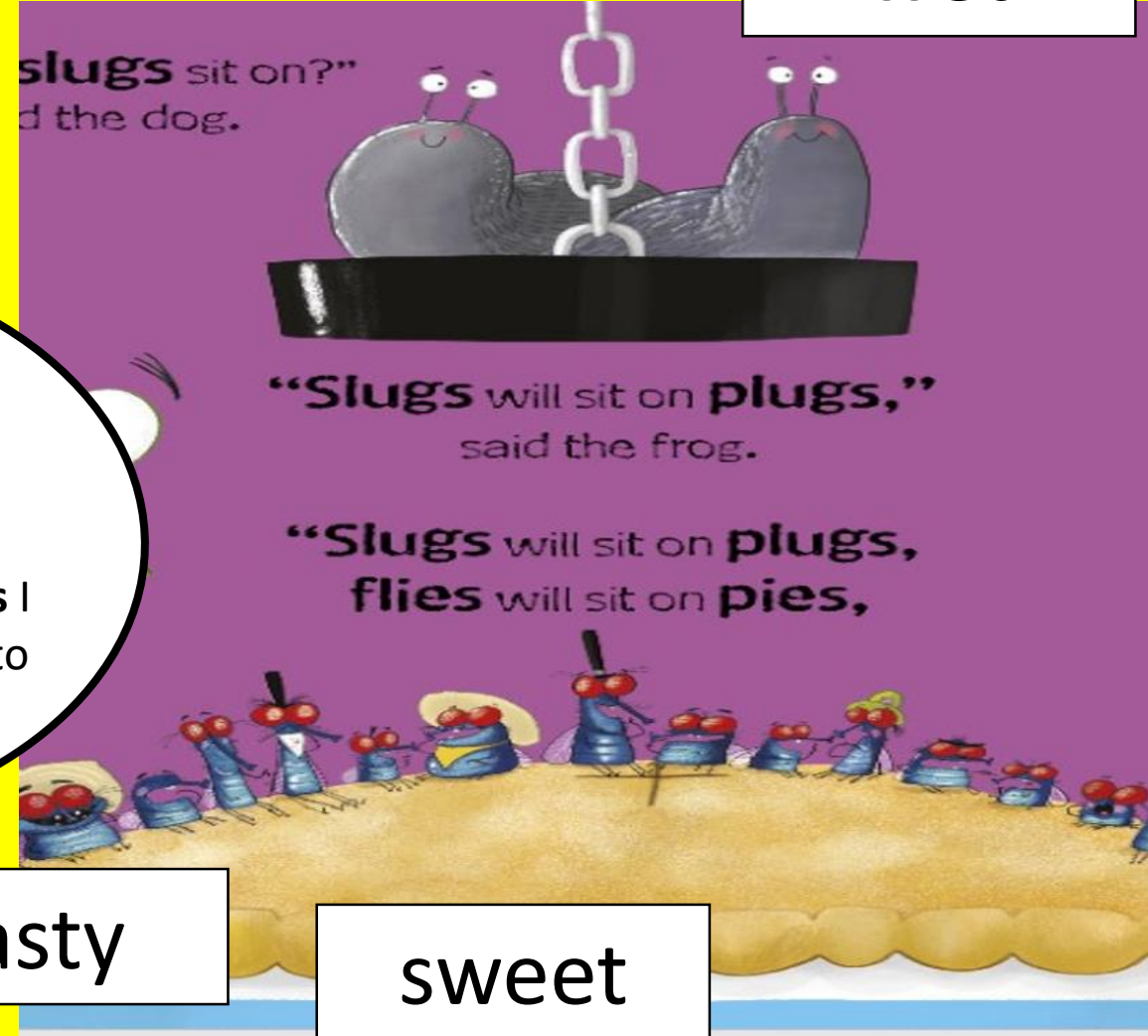

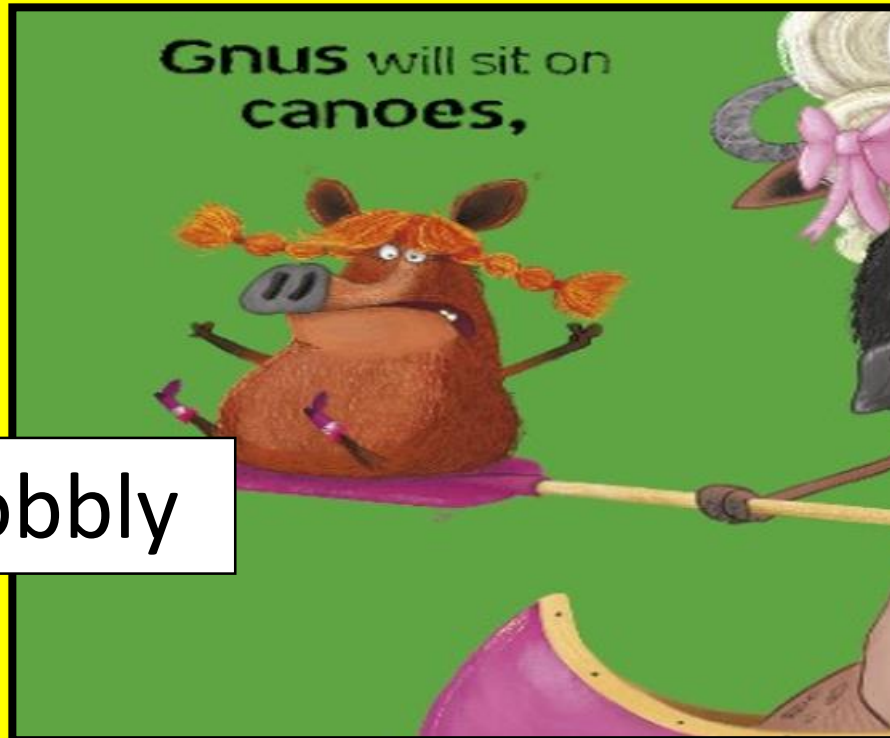

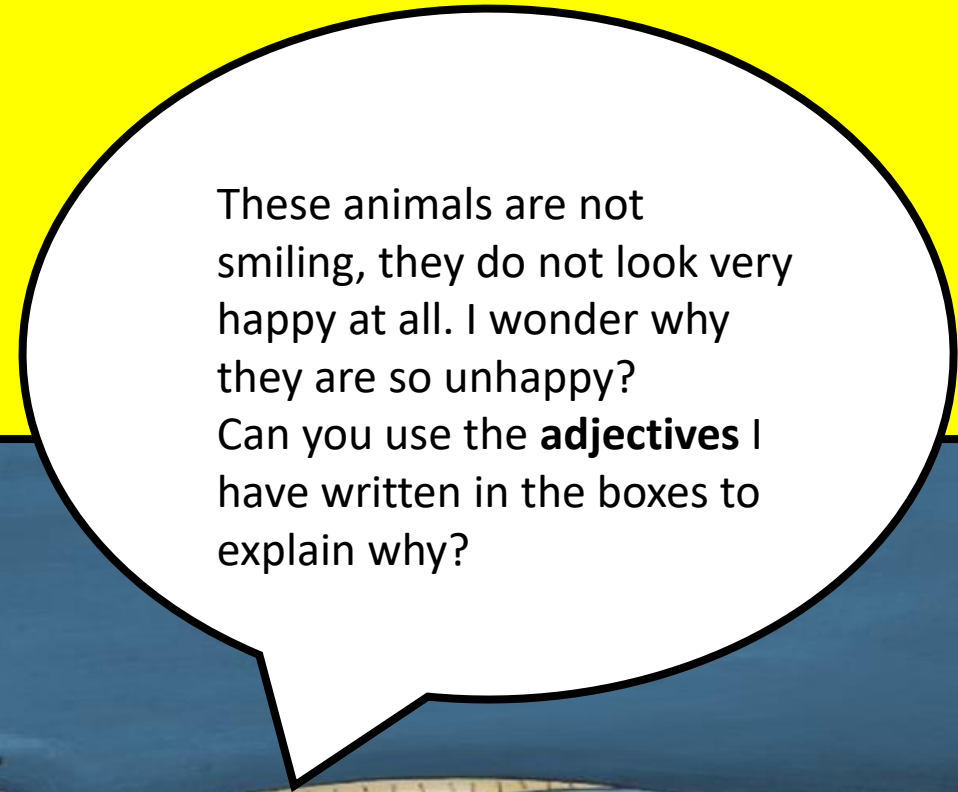
