Communication and Language

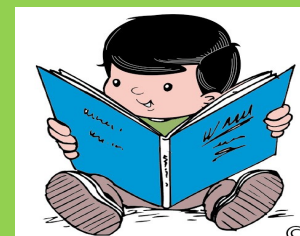
To use longer sentences of four to six words.

To recognise words with the same initial sounds.

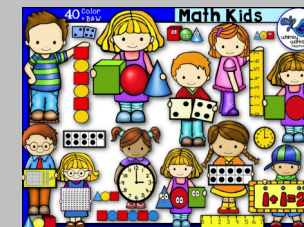


To be able to copy or write some or all of their name.

Expressive Arts

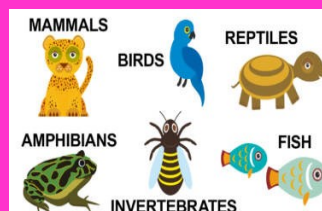
To remember and sing entire songs.
