Our assembly with Rev Andrew Wilson today focused on the story of Jonah and the Whale.

God instructed Jonah to go to the evil city of Nineveh and preach. Instead of obeying God, Jonah fled on a ship in the opposite direction. During the voyage, a great storm almost destroyed the ship. Realizing his sin might lead to the destruction of the ship, Jonah instructed the sailors to throw him overboard. The storm ceased and the ship was saved.

Jonah thought he would drown in the sea. But God wasn't through with him. He commanded a giant fish to swallow him. Inside the belly of the fish, Jonah asked God to forgive him. After three days, the fish spit Jonah onto dry land and he travelled to Nineveh as God had commanded. Satan was trying his best to destroy Jonah, but God loved Jonah and the people of Nineveh so much, He had another plan.



The moral of the story is that God comes to each of us in a unique way — sometimes through prayer, sometimes through reading scripture, sometimes through the gentle guidance of someone who loves us, like our parents.

We don't always want to do what God asks us, either because we are afraid, selfish, tired, or for any number of possible reasons. We learn from Jonah that God is merciful, which means he will call on us again and again to serve him, until we do what he asks us to do. He will never give up on us, because he created us to love and serve him. He would never abandon us, for we are exactly what he wanted us to be.

In the story, God uses a storm, a whale and a worm to teach Jonah about his mercy and kindness. Even though the whale and worm did not make Jonah feel very good, he learned from the experience. Sometimes God works this way in our lives, too. He might prevent us from taking a path that leads away from what he is asking us to do, or he might protect us from harm while we meditate about his goodness.

This divine protection, though it might be a little uncomfortable, is really just a sign of God's mercy: what doesn't kill you makes you stronger, as the saying goes. As long as you're still alive and ready to come back again, God will give you another chance to be a better friend to him and his people.




Breakfast Club is open from 07.45 - 8.55am. Please ensure that children are at breakfast club before 08.20am.


The documents required are;
