Y3 Spring Term 1 Curriculum Map (6weeks)

Our focus book this term is:

The Selfish Giant/The Happy Prince—by Oscar Wilde

The Selfish Giant" is a short fantasy story for children by the Irish author Oscar Wilde. It was first published in 1888 in the anthology The Happy Prince and Other Tales. The story's plot revolves around a giant who builds a wall to keep children out of his garden, but learns compassion from the innocence of the children.

The Happy Prince is a tale with multiple lessons. From one side it is the critic of the society that can be cruel and heartless and on the other side, it is about the compassion towards human troubles.

- Write a persuasive letter from the children to the giant.
- Write the next part of the story in the style of the author.
 - Write an alternative ending to 'The Selfish Giant'.
- Write an internal monologue in the role of the 'Swallow'.
- Write diary entries in the role of different characters.
