Sport Premium Allocation and Planned Spending

We will continue using the sports premium money to ensure the children at St John of Jerusalem get the best PE and Sports experience. This report outlines how we will spend the allocated **£17,150** PE and Sports funding. The PE lead will assess and review the school's needs based on observations and feedback from pupils and staff.

- 50% of the funding allocation on 31 October 2025
- 50% of the funding allocation on 30 April 2026

2. Physical Education,
3. Healthy Active Lifestyles,
4. Competitive Sports.
